

Food / Ingredients Manufacture:

Food / agri-related sector growth (functional foods, nutraceuticals, ingredients, protein excellence, aquaculture).

Sustainable Food Production:

Driving efficiency / value add focus from our food producing system (incl food manufacturing). Ties to efficient / sustainable land use.

Building Innovation:

Build off existing base, add modular, service and manufacturing base for golden triangle demand.

Advanced

Manufacturing:

Build on established base of advanced manufacturing industry.

Engineering & Processing Equipment:

Leverage specialist engineering and processing equipment base.

Digital & ICT:

Core digital / ICT growth, as well as focus on transformative technologies. Position Waikato as a hub for investors, R&D.

Research &

Development:

Build off existing strengths as a hub for Agri and other R&D (private enterprise, university and public sector).

Tech Logistics:

Develop supporting service areas (e.g. data centres).

Energy:

Focus on generation and distribution – real opportunities in distributed renewable generation (solar, wind, geothermal, waste to energy, hydrogen etc).


Green-Tech:

Promote development of Waikato hub for green-tech, and all that goes with it – environmental science and technology –bringing together education, research and investment.

High Value Tourism:

Focus on building high value, cultural, business/ event and adventure tourism. (Recognising current state, but noting that Tourism total share of regional GDP has been increasing faster than rest of NZ.)







AFFORDABLE HOUSING

Housing: Housing critical to success/wellbeing

of region, critical enabler of economic development. Needs council planning support, funding to enable scale and funding of infrastructure. Currently led

by the Regional Housing Initiative.

Construction: Broader construction capability and

capacity (vertical and horizontal) essential to underpin economic growth.

to Auckland & Tauranga.


Digital: World class broadband and digital
